Preamble

Dinox, a company duly incorporated under the laws of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) (“Company”, “We”, “we”, “Us”) understands that the collection of Personal data involves a great deal of trust on your part.

Please refer to this Cookie Policy carefully to know more about the Personal data collected and processed using Cookies. This Cookies Policy should be read and understood in conjunction with Dinox’s Privacy Policy, Legal Disclaimer and Website Terms & Conditions. Capitalized terms not defined in this Cookies Policy have the meanings set forth in the Privacy Policy and/or in the Terms & Conditions. By visiting the Website as a Visitor, you Consent to the practices described below.

Please refrain from visiting the Website as a Visitor if you do not accept this Cookies Policy, the Privacy Policy and/or the Terms & Conditions. Our website uses cookies to distinguish you from other users, provide a better experience when you browse our website, and improve our site’s performance and usefulness.

By continuing to browse the site, you are agreeing to our use of cookies. A cookie is a small data file that websites can place on your hard drive when you visit. A cookie file can contain information such as a user ID that tracks the pages you’ve visited within that site. The cookies on this website are primarily used to recognize that a user has visited the website previously and to track user traffic patterns.

We do not correlate this information with data about individual users, nor do we share this information or sell it to any third party. If you prefer not to receive cookies through the site, you can set your browser to warn you before accepting cookies and refuse the cookie when your browser alerts you to its presence.

1. Definitions

1.1. The following terms, as used herein shall have the following meanings respectively unless inconsistent with the subject or context. Other capitalized terms may be defined elsewhere in this Agreement and, unless otherwise indicated, shall have such meaning throughout this Agreement.

1.1.1. “Consent” shall mean any freely given, specific, informed, and unambiguous indication of which the Data subject, by a statement or by a clear affirmative action, signifies agreement to the processing of Personal data relating to him or her.

1.1.2. “Cookie(s)” means a piece of information that is placed automatically on your computer’s hard drive when you access the Website. The Cookies uniquely identifies your browser to the server. Cookies allow Dinox to store information on the server and the User’s preferences (for example language preferences, technical information, click or path information, etc.) to help make the Website experience better for you and to conduct Website analysis and performance review. The types of Cookies are further explained in this Cookies Policy.

1.1.3. “Data Controller” shall mean the natural or legal person, who, alone or jointly with others, determines the purposes and means of the Processing of Personal data and who is in charge of this Processing.

1.1.4. “Data Subject” shall mean the natural or legal persons whose data is processed, in the context of this Cookies Policy, the Visitor.

1.1.5. “Disclosure” shall mean making Personal data accessible, for example by permitting access, transmission, or publication.

1.1.6. “Personal Data Breach” shall mean a breach of security leading to the accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, or alteration of – or to the unauthorized disclosure of, or access to – Personal data transmitted, stored, or otherwise processed.

- 1.1.7. “Personal Data” shall mean any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person; an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural, or social identity of that natural person.
- 1.1.8. “Process” shall mean any operation with Personal data, irrespective of the means applied and the procedure, and in particular the collection, storage, use, revision, disclosure, archiving or destruction of data.
- 1.1.9. “Processing” shall mean any operation or set of operations – by automated and other means – that is performed upon Personal data or sets of Personal data, such as collecting, recording, organizing, structuring, storing, adapting, or altering, retrieving, consulting, using, disclosing by transmitting, disseminating, or otherwise making available, aligning, or combining, or erasing.
- 1.1.10. “Recipient” means third, public authority, agency, or other body – that is, someone or something other than the Data subject or the Company – to which the Personal data is disclosed.
- 1.1.11. “Third Parties” shall mean any person who is not bound by a contract of employment or service agreement with Dinox, or any entity affiliated with Dinox and any person who is not a Visitor.
- 1.1.12. “User” shall mean a person which has registered on the Website.
- 1.1.13. “Visitor” shall mean any individual or legal entity browsing the Website.
- 1.1.14. “Website” or “Dinox Website” shall mean this website accessible at the following URL: <https://dinox.io>
- 1.2. Except where the context requires otherwise, this Agreement will be interpreted as follows:
 - 1.2.1. Headings are for convenience only and shall not affect the construction or interpretation of any provision of this Agreement;
 - 1.2.2. Where a word or phrase is defined, other parts of speech and grammatical forms and the cognate variations of that word or phrase shall have corresponding meanings;

- 1.2.3. Words importing the singular shall include plural and vice versa;
- 1.2.4. Reference to Articles and Schedules are to articles and schedules of this Agreement;
- 1.2.5. All words (whether gender-specific or gender neutral) shall be deemed to include each of the masculine, feminine and neutral genders;
- 1.2.6. The ejusdem generis (of the same kind) rule will not apply to the interpretation of this Agreement, accordingly, include and including will be read without limitation;
- 1.2.7. A reference to any document (including this Agreement) is to that document as amended, consolidated, supplemented, novated, or replaced from time to time in terms thereof;
- 1.2.8. A reference to a statute or statutory provision includes, to the extent applicable at any relevant time;
- 1.2.9. That statute or statutory provision as from time to time consolidated, modified, re-enacted, or replaced by any other statute or statutory provision whether before or after the date of this Agreement; and
- 1.2.10. Any subordinate legislation or regulation made under the relevant statute or statutory provision;
- 1.2.11. References to writing include any mode of reproducing words in a legible and non-transitory form and shall include email or other electronic communication.

2. Type of Cookies

2.1. We use the following cookies:

2.1.1. Strictly necessary cookies: These are Cookies that are required for the operation of the Website. They include, for example, Cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of the Website and enter into transactions. These are used to recognize you when you return to our website, enabling us to personalize our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).

2.1.1.4. __RequestVerificationToken / Essential / Session

2.1.1.4.1. This is an anti-forgery cookie. It is designed to stop unauthorized posting of content to a website, known as Cross-Site Request Forgery. It holds no information about the user and is destroyed on closing the browser.

2.1.2. Analytical/performance cookies: They allow us to recognise and count the number of Visitors and to see how Visitors move around the Website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way the Website works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily. We use Google Analytics Cookies which collects information anonymously. It reports Website trends without identifying individual visitors. You can opt out of Google Analytics without affecting how you visit the Website. For more information on Google Analytics, please click [here](#).

2.1.2.1. This information is collected in an anonymous format and will be collated with similar information received from other users. We use these cookies to determine the usefulness of the information we supply to you and other users and to see how effective our navigation is in helping users reach that information.

2.1.2.3. _ga / Analytics / 2 year / Used to distinguish users.

2.1.2.4. _gid / Analytics / 24 hour / Used to distinguish users.

2.1.2.5. _gat / Analytics / 1 minute / Used to throttle request rate.

2.1.3. Targeting cookies: These Cookies record your visit to the Website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We will use this information to make the Website and the advertising displayed on it more relevant to your interests. We may also share this information with Third parties for this purpose.

2.2. **Cookie Expiration**

- 2.2.1. The cookies will remain on your computer after the browser is closed. Until removed, the cookies will become active again when the website is reopened. Cookies can be deleted by you, at any time, and will not collect any information when you are not accessing the website.

3. Personal Data Collected

- 3.1. The Cookies we use allow us the Processing of the following Personal data:
 - 3.1.1. IP Address;
 - 3.1.2. Date and time of connection the Website;
 - 3.1.3. Place of consultation of the Website;
 - 3.1.4. Time spent on the Website;
 - 3.1.5. Language settings and preferences;
 - 3.1.6. Data about the pages from the Website visited;
 - 3.1.7. Links you click on the Website;
 - 3.1.8. Features or services available on the Website;
 - 3.1.9. From which origin the User arrives on the Website;
 - 3.1.10. Device used.
- 3.2. By using the Website, you specifically Consent to the Processing of the Personal Data which is collected through Cookies. You may deactivate the use of Cookies by selecting appropriate parameters on your device. However, deactivation of this kind might prevent the use of certain functions of the Website.

4. Purpose of the Processing

- 4.1. The main reasons why we collect Personal data about you through Cookies are:
 - 4.1.1. to improve your browsing experience on the Website and to make it informative, personal and as user friendly as possible;
 - 4.1.2. to develop statistics from you use of the Website and to improve this latter thanks to that;
 - 4.1.3. to offer you other services and products by developing the marketing on the Website; and
 - 4.1.4. to improve your Visitor experience on the Website.

4.1.5. You hereby Consent to this Cookie Policy, and You also Consent that your Personal data is Collected and Processed for the foregoing purposes. You may revoke your Consent at any time for any use of your Personal data by the Company. Please note that the withdrawal of your Consent will not affect the lawfulness of the Processing of your Personal data based on your Consent before its withdrawal.

5. Use of Google Analytics

5.1. Most Web browsers are set up to accept cookies, although you can reset your browser to refuse all Cookies or to indicate when a cookie is being sent. Note, however, that some portions of the Website may not work properly if you refuse cookies.

5.2. The Website uses Google Analytics, an Internet site analysis service supplied by Google Inc. ("Google"). Google Analytics uses Cookies which are text files placed on your computer to help to analyse the use made of the Website by its users. The Data subject generated by the Cookies concerning your use of the Website (including your IP address) will be forwarded to, and stored by, Google on servers located outside of the Republic of Marshall Islands. Google will use this information to evaluate your use of the Website, compile reports on site activity for its publisher and provide other services relating to the activity of the Website and the use of the internet. Google may release these data to Third Parties if there is a legal obligation to do so or when the Third Parties process these data for the account of Google including, in particular, the publisher of the Website. Google will not cross-reference your IP address with any other data held by Google.

5.3. You may deactivate the use of Cookies by selecting appropriate parameters on your navigator. However, deactivation of this kind might prevent the use of certain functions of the Website. By using the Website, you specifically Consent to the Processing of your Personal data by Google under the conditions and for the purposes described above.

6. Third-party disclosure

6.1. Please note that Third Parties (including, for example, advertising networks and providers of external services like web traffic analysis services) may also use cookies, over which we have no control. These Cookies are likely to be analytical or performance Cookies or targeting cookies

7. Blocking Cookies

7.1. You block Cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies. However, if you use your browser settings to block all Cookies (including essential cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of the Website.
